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Chair's overview of the past year:

Camberwell St Giles REC Chair's report

I have now completed seven years as Chair of the committee and once again I express gratitude for the privilege of being involved in such interesting work among such a fine group of people.

As in previous years, a wide range of applications has come to us for review. Given our history as a committee with links to the Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and Neurosciences, most relate to mental health and we have a good number involving participants unable to consent for themselves. But ante-natal and end-of-life care have both featured on our agendas, plus many concerned with conditions between these two extremes. I trust that we have reviewed each application rigorously, fairly and courteously, always mindful of our responsibilities to protect participants and promote good research. I hope too that researchers have appreciated our approach and on occasion have felt that their work has been strengthened by our consideration of the ethical aspects.

We are becoming accustomed to reviewing social care research and I think we are developing an expertise that helps these projects meet high ethical standards.

We said good-bye to four excellent members, Alison Higgs, Justine Antill, Hilary Lavender and Rob McDowall; two others, Naomi Hare and Debbie Horney, have been, respectively, on maternity and matrimony leave. For a time we were on the edge of being inquorate but co-optees rescued us and we never actually dipped below seven. We have now welcomed Tom Gale, Larissa Revill and Mike Millar, so, for the moment, are feeling good. We are however always on the lookout for new people and I must confess that this, as well as the wider benefit to the REC world, is in my mind when I volunteer to interview potential members!

As I said last year, it was a real joy to welcome back Tina Cavaliere as our REC Manager and I am even more delighted to say this year that she is still with us. Her experience is considerable, her knowledge is vast and her minutes are impeccable – what more could a Chair want! She has been well-supported by Charlotte Ferris, Rebecca Howling and now Paolo Buscemi, and it a real strength for me to know that our organisation is in competent hands. The committee's relations with the Bristol office continue to work well and I am glad to note that our performance record is excellent.

I believe that this has been a year in which we have all worked together well to encourage significant research and to protect those who participate in it. I look forward to more of the same in the coming months.
