Chair's overview of the past year:

South Birmingham Research Ethics Committee has undergone a considerable change in membership during the last year. In March 2017, the Chair, Professor Simon Bowman stepped down and left the REC to pursue another role. During the year, the Alternate Vice-Chair, Reverend Barry Clark, Dr Sunil Thomas, Dr Andal Thirumalai, Dr Mary Glover and Dr Dalvina Hanu-Cernat also left either because they had reached the end of their tenure or, in the case of Dr Thomas, because of changes in their work commitments. The REC Manager was also redeployed. Alongside these changes was the death of another long-serving member, Mr Michael Andrews in May 2017.

Professor Paula McGee was appointed as the new Chair in April 2017 and Dr Kathryn Kinmond agreed to become Alternate Vice-Chair. There has been no Vice Chair since Dr Cochrane left in February 2018. Ms Ellen Swainston is now REC Manager and has formed a very good, supportive working relationship with the Chair and the members.

The reduction in the number of members posed a challenge. The remaining members launched a recruitment campaign targeting local hospitals, university departments, the GP network and individual professional networks. Five new members were recruited: two experts and three lay plus. More experienced members act as buddies to enable new people to settle into the committee. Despite the improvement in numbers, only three members are doctors, a marked reduction from seven. Efforts continue to try to address this issue.

South Birmingham REC normally meets every month, with the exception of February and July. However, meetings were cancelled in November and December 2017 owing to a shortage of applications. Discussion is constructive and robust. Applicants are made welcome and feedback is positive: 'very good service' 'no concerns – very fair and thorough'. Several observers have attended and have found the experience useful. The REC was audited in December 2017 and received full accreditation for the next three years.

Members have attended training events throughout the year and shared the slides at meetings. Articles circulated at Chairs' meetings, e.g. on vulnerability, have also been shared. More could be done with this information and the REC will address the best way to address this issue.
