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Chair's overview of the past year:

As the restructuring of NRES continues and innovations such as the ethics officer role are introduced the number of ethics committees continues to be reduced and it is interesting to consider what the research ethics review process will look like in several years' time. In my opinion the research ethics committee with its mix of members from various backgrounds and specialities provides the best tool for reaching a decision about complex ethical issues yet devised and I hope that they will continue to be the mainstay of this process whatever else changes.
