Chair's overview of the past year:

I joined Camberwell St Giles REC as its Chair in April 2011 and have appreciated being involved in its work over the past year.

My first word must be of gratitude to the members. Inevitably, some took the opportunity to leave as we entered a new period with a different Chair and committee name. I was glad however to inherit some excellent people and I particularly express my gratitude to Evan Stone QC who continued as Vice-chair and brought much-valued wisdom and experience to that role. We also welcomed some new members, either by transfer from another committee or as totally fresh to RECs, among them Sally Gordon Boyd who became the committee's Alternate Vice-chair. Work and family commitments meant that three recently-appointed members found it necessary to step down and on some occasions we had to co-opt members of other RECs to ensure quoracy. All the members have contributed to the discussions and decisions in their distinctive ways and I have thoroughly enjoyed the lively sessions.

Though we have a good range of members, I am conscious that we are short of medical expertise. An appeal via the Institute of Psychiatry resulted in fifteen expressions of interest and, though I recognise that NRES, the appointing authority, has limitations on recruitment, I hope that we can follow these up as a matter of urgency so that we become a more rounded committee.

We met eleven times in the year and dealt with the interesting range of applications described elsewhere in this report. We have a particular expertise in reviewing projects involving the Mental Capacity Act and are glad to be flagged by NRES for this purpose. We have engaged in conversation with some excellent researchers and I trust that we have reviewed them all courteously, fairly and thoroughly. I believe that we have come to reasonable decisions on each application and, when follow-up has been necessary, we have done so within the guidelines. Our sub-committee for amendments, comprising Evan Stone, Jennifer Bostock, Veena Kumari and myself has also worked well.

We have been well-served by Co-ordinators and their colleagues. Audrey Adams took responsibility for my first meeting but Charis Bailey took over for the remainder of the year and brought accuracy and understanding to the role. Charis is based in Fulbourn, Cambridge, and there was some initial concern that being outside London might cause problems for researchers. The location has in fact worked well and the support from others in the office, particularly Lynda McCormack, the office manager, has been particularly helpful.

The difference between the office and committee locations has caused a little confusion over accountabilities but, broadly, the administration looks to the East of England while, as Chair, I have made what I feel are useful links with the London network. We have followed the developments in NRES with interest though occasionally suggested ways in which communication of these could be improved. A number of our members have undertaken training but we recognise that there is room for improvement in this aspect of our life.

Throughout the year, we have been clear about our responsibilities to protect participants and promote good research and we look forward to continuing this approach in the coming months.
