#### Chair's overview of the past year:

Last year I started my overview with 寧為太平犬,不做亂世人 or "may you live in interesting times" which was a miss translation of "It's better to be a dog in a peaceful time than be a man in a chaotic period". Well I think we remain people rather than canines! Which I used to reflect the great changes going on last year in NRES and how our committee have tried to work with these changes.

Well! Another year has passed and the changes continue. The full introduction of proportionate review, establishment of the Health Research Authority and the cultural change that RECs are there to support researchers as well as ensure the safety and wellbeing of participants. Obviously, our primary scope is the safety and welfare of participants but Sunderland REC have taken the view to ensure we meet this principle goal we should work with researchers rather than take a proscriptive line. I will discuss later how we have worked towards this.

#### Statistics:

Generally, when I write this overview I try to avoid reiterating the stats in the report as readers can review them themselves, however there are a few points I would like to make:

1/ Of the 11 full meetings and 10 Proportionate review meetings we have been quorate for all with a median attendance of 7 members and mean of 7.9 which I feel is excellent considering we have now expanded our meetings from 11 per year to 21 per year including PR.

2/ Our mean applications per full meeting was 5.36.

3/ Not all the data is good, of the 73 substantial amendments 3 breached the 35 day target (largest breach 3 days over). I believe this is down to the increased workload of PR meetings and something we need to look at next year.

#### Training:

Sunderland REC has a long held belief that our researcher colleagues (be they academics or industry) are partners who can benefit from working with RECs to establish excellent ethical research studies that will be of benefit to present and future patients. In recognising this, as Chairman, I have continued the programme of educational days (in partnership with our regional Clinical Research Network, with a personal thanks to Mr Tom Wooldridge from N & TW CLRN for facilitating this) for researchers and research staff in the ethics and the informed consent process, as described in the training data below, as well as encouraging researchers to attend our committee as observers. This has resulted in Sunderland REC leading 5 study days and accommodating 10 observers.

In conclusion, I feel that although we have breached some targets this has been another successful year for Sunderland REC.
