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Chair's overview of the past year:

During 2011-12 there were three resignations from the Research Ethics Committee (REC). Angelia Ong and Ann Stoddart had both been on long term sabbatical for personal reasons and decided that their personal circumstances were such that they should resign. The REC was sorry to see them go, but delighted when Angelia Ong brought her baby daughter, Lucinda, to visit the REC in December 2011. We were also sad to lose Sue Baines, who had been a member for two years. We wish them all well for the future.

The REC was pleased to welcome three new members: Peter Owen, a very experienced lay member from Liverpool who transferred to Greater Manchester West, Mark Garrod, a lay member with some links to the research community, and lestyn Shapey, a core surgical trainee who has an intercalated degree in medical ethics. They are all already proving to be valuable additions to the REC.

The two most significant developments this year have been the introduction of Proportionate Review Sub-Committees (PRSCs) and the revision of the Governance Arrangement Framework for Research Ethics Committees (GAFREC). Greater Manchester West was a pilot site for Proportionate Review. There have been 11 PRSCs held during the year (including Christmas week!), some by e-mail, some by telephone conference, and some as supplementary meetings to the main REC meeting. I am very grateful to members who have supported this process, which I appreciate places a significant additional burden on the REC. Some clinical members have difficulty meeting attendance requirements for the main REC meetings and participation in PRSC can help to address this, but for most members PRSC is in addition to the full work of the main REC. Overall 93 applications were reviewed during the year, either by full Committee or PRSC, and all applications include a full set of paperwork which the REC members have to read. This is a substantial workload.

The revised GAFREC and Standard Operating Procedures have led to significant changes in the work of the REC. In particular, we no longer review most studies on NHS staff. A training session to familiarise members with the new arrangements was held at the end of the October meeting. We experienced a small reduction in applications in the autumn, and one REC meeting was cancelled, but we are now back to full agendas.

Thank you to all the members, and those co-opted from other RECs who have attended to ensure we are quorate, for their time and commitment preparing for meetings, providing input into the REC's deliberations, and making the job of the Chair such a pleasant one. I believe Greater Manchester West is a very friendly and effective REC, providing robust review within required timescales. None of this would be possible without the hard work of our Co-ordinator, Shehnaz Ishaq, and her assistant, Ashley Totenhofer. I should like to express my particular thanks to them for ensuring that applicants are dealt with courteously and efficiently and for all their support during the year.
