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Chair's overview of the past year:

April 2015- March 2016 has been a busy year for the Cambridge Central Committee, as usual. We review six applications each month, and many are often fairly complex studies. We have also had some turnover in staff and have been working with a relatively new manager and a new support member for the manager, and we have experience the new HRA reviews system.

Overall, we have a strong committee with exceptional expertise and dedication to the thorough review of applications. This enables us to keep up with the busy workload, although I think that the time frames for discussing the applications and meeting with the applicants (30 min timeslots) would benefit from review and flexibility based on complexity of the application. For simple and straightforward studies, this time frame is very reasonable; for very complex or inconsistently documented studies it is not. We routinely overrun by 30 minutes, but sometimes more if all six applications are complex, which is not uncommon.

The turnover in members has not been significant, and we have gained a member with paediatric expertise which has been of significant benefit. We also have a rotating 1 year post that is filled by a junior doctor, which works well. However, the process for recruiting, interviewing, and then starting new members is very slow, which results in the risk of having too few members to be quorate and we have had to co-opt members for a number of meetings this year. If there is a way to support more rapid recruitment and start dates of committee members, I would be happy to do this.

With respect to committee composition, I have had some comments over the past year of insufficient medical expertise. As noted above we receive exceptionally complex medical applications and do require significant medical expertise on the committee. We have recently had more members with medical expertise join, however, recruitment to the committee does need focus on key expertise areas in order to maintain this fine balance, and it would be helpful to involve the chairs and committee members in the recruitment process.

With respect to training committee members have reported to me that they are finding it difficult to register for training due to all places being full even when they log into the training portal on the same day that they were informed of the training or that many of the locations are inconvenient. I have noticed that more training is currently being held in Cambridge, which is helpful. However, I wonder if review of prioritising member registration over non-member and having flexibility for adding additional places is possible. I faced a similar problem in trying to access new chair training. In addition, we are working within our committee to set up ethics discussion groups to support self-directed training.

I think it is important to note that I receive significant support from the Nottingham office. Linda, Jess, Andrea, and Rebecca are always very supportive and responsive to queries, which is tremendously helpful and make my duties significantly easier. Ann Tunley has also provided wonderful support throughout the year. I am a bit concerned about additional workloads placed on the REC managers and how this may affect the necessary and valuable support we receive from them.
