Chair's overview of the past year:

This is my second spell of chairing an NRES committee. I was appointed, to succeed Prof Margaret Rees, on the day of the May 2013 meeting, but the notice was too short to attend that day, so I first appeared in June. I was at once impressed with the commitment of members to the review task, and with the high level of ethical debate.

I pay particular tribute to Robert King, who fulfilled the duties of Vice Chair admirably until his ten years of membership meant he had to retire in January 2014. Robert, I gathered, had given over 20 years of service to research ethics committees, including the old Broadmoor ethics committee. He will be greatly missed.

For the rest of the membership, it has been a period of stability. Dr Richard Craven joined at the same time as I did, and brings welcome physiological expertise. I am especially pleased that the offices of Vice Chair and Alternate Vice Chair have been filled by existing members, Drs Kim Cheetham and Liesl Osman. All the members are happy to introduce the discussion of a study.

Sub-committees, for proportionate review of studies and for considering amendments, are held in correspondence. I had previously been used to face-to-face or telephone sub-committee meetings, but correspondence works well. In the coming year, we aim to give members more opportunities to take part in sub-committee work.

The Committee has been very fortunate in being managed by highly competent and hard-working staff from the Bristol office, especially Siobhan Bawn until her maternity leave, and since then Tom Fairman, together with their assistants. It has been a pleasure to work with them. It is largely thanks to the staff that the Committee was awarded full accreditation following a periodic audit by the Quality Assurance team in October 2013.
